

Sanford Fargo Cancer Program Practice Profile Reports

Sanford's Roger Maris Cancer Center has access to Commission on Cancer (CoC) quality measure performance rates, through the National Cancer Database's (NCDB) Rapid Cancer Reporting System (RCRS). These web-based reports offer providers comparative information to assess adherence to and consideration of standard of care treatments for five cancer types. Currently, the CoC has developed eleven measures, comprised of two different measure types. There are evidence-based or accountability measures that demonstrate provider accountability, where there is high levels of evidence supporting these measures. Quality improvement measures monitor the need for quality improvement within the organization. The CoC sets an expected estimated performance rate for nine of the eleven measures.

The table shows data from 2017 - 2019, from each of the nine Accountability and Quality Improvement measures with expected EPRs. The data is based on what was most recently available in RCRS at the time of the report.

BCSRT (NQF #219) Radiation therapy is administered within 1 year (365 days) days of diagnosis for women under age 70 receiving breast conserving surgery for breast cancer. (Accountability)	90%	98.10%	95.76%	97.94%

LCT Systemic chemotherapy is administered within 4 months to day preoperatively or day of surgery to 6 months postoperatively, or it is recommended for surgically resected cases with pathologic, lymph node-positive (pN1) and (pN2) NSCLC. (Quality Improvement)	85%	100%	No Data	No Data

RECRTCT Preoperative chemo and radiation are administered for clinical AJCC T3N0, T4N0 or Stage III; or Postoperative chemo and radiation are administered within 180 days of diagnosis for clinical AJCC T1-2N0 with pathologic AJCC T3N0, T4N0, or Stage III; or treatment is recommended; for patients under the age of 80 receiving resection for rectal cancer.
